## THE BROKEN CHAIN


We little knew that morning that God was going to call your name. In life we loved you dearly. In death we do the same.

Harry Marvin Anthony transitioned to eternal rest on Saturday, December 24, 2022. He was born on September 21, 1929, in Longview, North Carolina to the late James Amos Anthony and Francis Rink Anthony. He was the ninth child out of ten, all preceded him in death. He was also preceded in death by his wife, Mary Elizabeth Anthony.

Harry enlisted in the United States Army in 1948. He served in two of our nation's wars, Vietnam and Korea. During his tour in Vietnam, he received the Purple Heart, while serving as a Supply Sergeant, aircraft mechanic, and door gunner on-board military helicopters. His assignments were numerous, including being assigned to the Nations' premiere Airborne Division, the 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, NC.
